

**Emergency Financial Manager of the City of Ecorse  
(Directive No. 033)**

**ORDER OF THE EMERGENCY FINANCIAL MANAGER OF THE CITY OF ECORSE,  
COUNTY OF WAYNE, STATE OF MICHIGAN, ENACTING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS  
AND ADDITIONS TO TAKE EFFECT 15 DAYS AFTER THE EXECUTION OF THIS  
DIRECTIVE.**

WHEREAS, under the Local Government Fiscal Responsibility Act, Act 72, Public Acts of Michigan, 1990, as amended ("Act 72") and a Contract (the "Contract") between the State of Michigan and Joyce A. Parker, dated October 30, 2009, Joyce A. Parker has been appointed as the Emergency Financial Manager (the "EFM") of the City of Ecorse, County of Wayne, Michigan (the "City") and charged with the power to take actions with respect to the City, including the power to exercise the authority and responsibilities of the Mayor, as the Chief Administrative Officer of the City, and of the City Council, as the governing body of the City, concerning the adoption, amendment and enforcement of ordinances or resolutions affecting the financial condition of the City as provided in the Home Rule City Act, Act 279, Public Acts of Michigan, 1909, as amended ("Act 279"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 72 and the Contract, the EFM, as the Chief Administrative Officer of the City, is authorized to, among other things, make, approve or disapprove any appropriation, contract, expenditure, or loan for the City, as well as, exercise the authority and responsibilities of the chief administrative officer and governing body concerning the adoption, amendment, and enforcement of ordinances or resolutions affecting the financial condition of the city as she may deem necessary, within her sole discretion, to accomplish the purposes of Act 72; and.

WHEREAS it is in the best interests of the City to amend its ordinances to enact and establish a current fee schedule, specifically amending Chapter 2 Section 2.233 Building Fees, Section 2.234 Electrical Fees, Section 2.235 Plumbing Fees, Section 2.236 Mechanical Fees, in order to increase or change certain fees, and add Section 2.232(a) as a municipal civil infraction enforcement remedy for certain identified violations. In furtherance of the enactment of the afore referenced City Ordinance amendments and additions, pursuant to Chapter IX, Section 1 and all other pertinent provisions of the City of Ecorse Charter the Emergency Financial Manager did, pursuant to Directive 28 executed June 17, 2010, direct all Ordinance amendments and additions to first reading and a summary of said provisions were published in accordance with the Charter mandates and due process and citizens have had over 30 days to ask questions, make comments and otherwise be heard on the matter. Therefore, the best interests of the City require the Emergency Financial Manager to move all said provisions to second reading, thereby effectively enacting the above ordinance amendments and additions to take effect 15 days following the execution of this Directive.


This Directive is necessary in order to carry out the duties and responsibilities required of the Emergency Financial Manager as set forth in Public Act 72, the contract between the Local Emergency Financial Assistance Loan Board and the Emergency Financial Manager and, additionally, is considered necessary to implement the financial plan.

**RESOLVED, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE EMERGENCY FINANCIAL MANAGER OF  
THE CITY OF ECORSE, PURSUANT TO PUBLIC ACT 72 AND THE CONTRACT, THAT:**

1. Ordinance provisions amending Chapter 2 Section 2.233 Building Fees, Section 2.234 Electrical Fees, Section 2.235 Plumbing Fees, Section 2.236 Mechanical Fees, in order to increase or change certain fees, and the addition of Section 2.232(a) as a municipal civil infraction enforcement remedy for certain identified violations are hereby moved to second reading, thereby enacting all ordinance amendments and additions, directing the immediate publication of their enactment, said ordinance provisions to take effect 15 days after the execution date of this Directive.

2. Repeal. All orders of the EFM, resolutions of the City Council of the City and parts of resolutions or orders in conflict with this Order are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
